

Mas d'en Gil Coma Vella

The Producer

Mas d'en Gil is one of the most prestigious wineries in Priorat (one of the most exiting Spanish DOs of the moment). They own a 125 hectare estate in the municipal district of Bellmunt del Priorat. They benefit from a slate soil, a micro-climate of broad temperature ranges and warm, humid air from south easterly breezes. The Rovira family bought the estate in 1981. Taking advantage of the unrivalled natural conditions of the land and combining tradition and technology, they now produce unique and complex wines. One of their wines, Coma Vella 2000, got them the Spanish Red Wine Trophy at the International Wine Challenge 2003.

Tasting Note

Cherry colour and wine ruby rim. Fresh aromas of ripe fruit (ripe plums and figs) on a balsamic background with fort notes of smoke. In the mouth it has a balanced and vivid entry. The finish is long with lingering notes of spice (black pepper and liquorice).



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
