### The Producer

Bodegas San Valero started as a co-operative in 1945. Like everywhere else in this region, bulk production of wines took priority. However, Bodegas San Valero then evolved and pioneered bottling in Aragon in 1962. They then adopted the so-called “controlled grape-harvest” in 1983 as part of their unstoppable quest for total quality.

Today, Bodegas San Valero produce wines of immense quality, which are both extrovert in style as well as having great commercial potential.

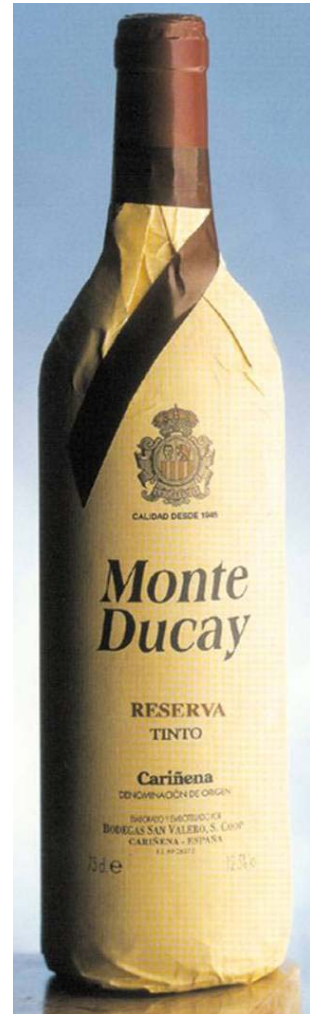
