The Producer

The winery is family run and has links with the wine world going back three generations. It is located in Pesquera, Ribera del Duero, a land of dry summers and long, hard winters. The vines used are the purest of the indigenous Tempranillo grape varieties known as Tinto Fino. The soils of the Ribera del Duero provide imbue the wine with deep colour, good back bone as well as great aromatic potential.

Tasting Notes

This wine displays an intense, ripe black cherry colour, revealing bright purple glints on swirling. On the nose, it is powerful and concentrated which develops well with mineral touches that denote an outstanding mineral terroir. Liquorice, mulberry and blackberry aromas intermingle with creamy, toasty hints, suggesting cinnamon, ginger, clove and aniseed notes with cacao and vanilla coming through. On the palate, it is silky with unctuous tannins but has also a very powerful structure and a well-balanced acidity with a excellent, long finish.



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
